# Firearms Legislation Pending/Passed/Vetoed

This is a subset of firearms and weapons bills that were recently or are currently before the Michigan Legislature. Michigan Open Carry does not take a formal position on many of them. This information is given here as an aid to the reader so he can contact his or her representative and voice his support or opposition as appropriate.

# 2013-2014 Session

**SB** 977 would allow active duty military service members, reservists, and guardsmen to file CPL renewals by mail. This was passed by the Senate but stalled in the House and died last session.

**SB 213** modifies many aspects of carry, including CPL class certifications expiring after five years, eliminates some establishments from PFZ restrictions, and replaces the County Gun Boards with the MI State Police. This bill was introduced in the Senate but died last session. MOC strongly supported this bill.

**HB** 4774, **HB** 4775, and **HB** 4776 propose to change the regulation of selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of firearms. These have were only introduced in the House and died last session. MOC strongly opposed these bills.

**HB 4262** proposes new restrictions to the carrying of knives. This bill was passed by the House but died last session.

**SB 407** proposed to modify MCL 28.4250 to add language defining "Gun-Free Zone" signage. This bill was only been introduced in the Senate but died last session. MOC opposed this bill.

**HB 4872** proposed changes to the law affecting people who have been ordered by a court not to possess firearms. This bill was only introduced in the House but died last session. MOC opposed this bill.

**HB 4332** provided for members of the military to obtain a CPL at 18 years of age. This bill was only introduced in the House but died last session.

**SB 63** declared that personal firearms, accessories, and ammunition that are manufactured in Michigan and do not leave the state are not subject to Federal regulation. This bill passed out of committee but died last session. MOC supported this bill.

**HB 4457** declared that personal firearms, accessories, and ammunition that are manufactured in Michigan and do not leave the state are not subject to Federal regulation. This bill imposed criminal penalties against federal officials who violate this law. This bill was only introduced in the House but died last session. MOC supported this bill.

**SB 49** and **HB 4349** add a FOIA exemption to the pistol registration database. SB 49 has been signed into law. MOC supported this bill.

HB 4104 and HB 4105 attempted to add public libraries to the list of

pistol free zones, and HB 4104 prohibits open carry in pistol free zones. These bills were only introduced in the House but died last session. MOC strongly opposed these bills.

**HB 4027** would have given Michigan workers the right to store a firearm in their car on private property, i.e. their employer's parking lot or garage. This bill was only introduced in the House but died last session.

**HB 5085** adds a person who has certain training (safety course or training required for a CPL) to the list of people a minor is allowed to possess or shoot a pistol with. This bill has been signed into law.

**SB** 610 allows manufacture, sale, and possession of a short-barreled shotgun (SBS) or short-barreled rifle (SBR) in Michigan. This bill has been signed into law.

**SB 572** would have allowed tasers in pistol-free zones for CPL holders. This bill passed out of committee but died last session.

**HB** 4283 would have allowed certain rifles to be used to hunt deer in the southern part of the state. This bill passed the House but died last session.

**HB 4134** createed a special class of people by creating CPL training exemptions for peace officers and active duty or retired military. This bill was passed by the House but died last session. MOC strongly opposed this bill.

**HB 4350** created another special class of people by allowing prosecutors and former LEOs to carry firearms in pistol-free zones. This bill was passed by the House but died last session. MOC strongly opposed this bill.

**HB 4133** created another special class of people by allowing active or retired corrections officers, probation officers, and parole officers to carry firearms in pistol-free zones. This bill was passed by the House but died last session. MOC strongly opposed this bill.

**SB** 984 eliminated the contiguous state requirement for long gun purchases. This bill has been enacted into law.

**HB 5091** and **HB 5092** clarify the definition of brandishing and explicitly state that the lawful open carry of a holstered pistol or slung rifle is not brandishing. HB 5091 was passed by both the House and Senate but vetoed by the governor. MOC strongly supported these bills.

House Bills 4155, 5324, 5325, 5326, 5327 and 5328, collectively known as the "Firearms Records Confidentiality Package," pass overwhelmingly in the legislature and get sent to the governor for his signature. These bills aim to rework the current regulations regarding how firearms records are collected, used, and accessed. They reiterate that information contained in a firearms record is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act. HB 4155, 5325, and 5328 were signed into law. MOC supported these bills.

**SB 789** eliminated county gun boards. This bill was passed by both the Senate and House but was vetoed by the governor. MOC supported this bill.

**HB 5500** adds teeth to Michigan's firearms preemption law by forcing units of government that lose in court to pay for plaintiff's legal costs, provides punishment for elected officials who knowingly and willfully violate preemption, and grants standing to groups to bring lawsuits. This bill was only introduced in the House. MOC strongly supported this bill.

# 2015-2016 Session

**SB 34** and **SB 35** eliminates county gun boards. This bill has been passed by both the Senate and House. MOC supports this bill.

**SB 53** creates another special class of people by allowing retired federal officers to carry firearms in pistol-free zones. MOC strongly opposes this bill.

**HB 4159** creates another special class of people by allowing active or retired corrections officers, probation officers, and parole officers to carry firearms in pistol-free zones. This bill has been passed by the House. MOC strongly opposes this bill.

**HB 4160** and **HB 4161** clarify the definition of brandishing and explicitly state that the lawful open carry of a holstered pistol or slung rifle is not brandishing. MOC strongly supports this bill.

# Winning the Battle and Losing the War Dan Griffin (gryphon)



Over the past several years, organizations such as Everytown for Gun Safety and Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America (MDA, formerly One Million Moms for Gun Control) have pressured companies such as Starbucks and Panera to prohibit firearms in their businesses. Their latest target is Kroger brand stores.

While some companies have issued what amounts to meaningless statements saying that they request that patrons not carry firearms into their stores, others such as Walmart and Kroger have stated that they will follow state law and refuse to bend to the will of Bloomberg and his paid minions. In fact, the Demanding Moms have been formally ejected off of several properties, while no open or concealed firearms carriers have been similarly treated.

Even though some statements from some corporate headquarters have asked that people refrain from carrying firearms onto their properties, at the same time they have stated that they will not refuse to serve those patrons nor ask them to leave. These seem like nothing more than public relations statements issued to keep anti-freedom groups such as MDA at arm's length.

Americans for Responsible Solutions scrounges for ideas and money However, despite no business actually prohibiting the carrying of firearms by patrons, many gun carriers, particularly open carriers, have stated that they will no longer patronize those businesses. They have elected to vote with their dollars and not reward those businesses because they didn't take a strong enough stand for the Second Amendment. In my opinion this is a mistake.

By refusing to carry their firearms into those stores who have never prohibited it, they are accomplishing through their own actions what MDA could not through all of their protesting and expensive ad campaigns. In their minds these gun owners are punishing the stores by not shopping there. In effect they may be winning the smaller, personal battle, but by doing so are losing the larger war. Remember, our fight is not against Panera or Starbucks, our fight is against MDA and Bloomberg and Everytown and the Brady Campaign Against Gun Violence. Each of us may deny a store a few dollars profit, but the real message we would be sending to the public is that MDA controls the narrative and is winning. Don't give in to MDA.

What the public will see, what the businesses will see, and what the antigunners will see is that if they want guns banned or prohibited in stores, all they have to do is get in the news and they can effectively get them banned (even though they were never actually banned to begin with).

Some hard-liners assert that by shopping there we are rewarding bad behavior. That is, we are giving our money to stores who are not staunchly pro-Second Amendment. I strongly disagree with this view. By not shopping there you are rewarding the bad behavior of the true enemies of freedom. The fact is that we should continue to shop and open carry in these places to show MDA for the pathetic, weak, antiliberty organization that it is. Remember, none of these businesses banned guns. None put up "no guns" signs. None said they would ask you to leave if you carried a gun in their store. I repeat, none prohibited guns. I have a hard time listening to someone tell me how evil these companies are because some corporate mouthpiece put out a noncommittal public relations statement trying to placate both the pro-gun and anti-gun crowds. Remember, they could just have easily banned guns altogether, but they purposefully chose not to do so. Does that count for nothing? I would rather save my ire and withhold my money from businesses that actually prohibit firearms on their premises.

This is why "normalization" of open carry is important. We have to take the language back. Bearing arms is either a fundamental right or it is not. While the Demanding Moms keep shilling for non-binding policies in restaurants, we – slowly but surely – are winning where it matters, in the court houses and state houses. Let's not let them think that by using pressure tactics they are winning in the court of public opinion and on the street when they are not.

It is important to publically resist MDA. The cries of "We have to do something!" and "It's a good start" are nonstop. Simply prohibiting open carry, MDA's current goal, accomplishes nothing and they know it. Just because one can't see a gun doesn't mean one doesn't exist. They full well know that shoppers could be carrying concealed and no one would

be the wiser, but it's one brick in the wall that they think they can move. Much of the public are often not politically aware, and that provides MDA the opportunity to advance anti-2A policies, whether they be through legislation or influencing private business rules. Open carry can be prohibited, but relatively few people open carry. They know that getting open carry banned in no way mitigates what they see as "danger" because most people carry concealed. The next logical step is they must prohibit concealed carry to actually be "safe in public."

Unfortunately even that isn't all they have set their sights on. Their ultimate goal is an end to the private ownership of guns in the United States. Hardly a day goes by where I don't read at least one article by someone or some group calling for the elimination of guns in the United States. One of the recent articles attempted to cast the United States in a bad light because we have a higher *firearms* suicide rate than Japan does. Their argument was that we should emulate Japan and eliminate the private ownership of guns. The problem with that argument, though, is that Japan actually has a higher *overall* suicide rate than the U.S., they just don't use guns. Their statistic is meaningless, but they hope it sounds persuasive to people who aren't critical thinkers. A few weeks ago the Tallahassee Democrat, a Gannett newspaper, flat out called for a gun ban and repeal of the Second Amendment.

Remember, the only gun control that will be even remotely effective is a complete, 100% gun ban. Back when groups like the National Coalition to Ban Handguns and Handgun Control Incorporated were new, they described a process whereby they were going to completely do away with handgun ownership by slowly adding one little restriction on top of another over a couple of decades. More than 40 years later they are still sticking to that strategy with new language and new tactics, but the target—destruction of the "gun culture" and the right to keep and bear arms—remains the same.

We in the pro-2A community often talk about bringing others into the fold, to turn antis into pro-2A people. We don't shun others who are not rabidly anti-2A, we try to show them that gun owners are good. Why treat businesses any differently than we would someone personally who was on the fence about guns? We would try to encourage individuals to become pro-2A by giving them positive experiences with guns; we would talk to them, we would take them to the range. The same thing should apply to businesses. They haven't banned us, they are ambivalent, or on the fence. Let's try to encourage them to become pro-2A by giving them positive experiences with gun-owners, not make enemies of them.

# If You Can't Take Training Classes, You Can Still Train

As readers of this newsletter know, I am a big advocate of firearms training. I've linked many articles to training and preparing for training. I've even written an article about a few classes I've taken.

Paraphrasing Donald Rumsfeld, "There are known knowns, there are known unknowns, but there are also unknown unknowns." If you have grabbed a pencil and

are now trying to diagram that like a Zork map or the family tree in the song, "I'm My Own Grandpa," let me save you the trouble: it means you don't know what you don't know.

That's why I am a proponent of professional training. But what if, for whatever reason, you can't attend a professional instruction class? Or at least can't attend one in the near future? While there is no substitute for personal instruction where you can be evaluated, thanks to instructors who make training courses available on DVD from companies such as Thunder Ranch and Magpul Dynamics, you can still benefit from the experience and knowledge of people like Clint Smith, Travis Haley, and Chris Costa, to name a few.

If you are lucky enough to live in the country where you can set up any type of live fire course, or belong to a gun club with a tactical range, you can practice live fire at multiple distances with multiple targets, barriers, and movement. But if your gun club doesn't allow you to go beyond the firing line, or you primarily shoot at a commercial indoor range, or a DNR range where you can't set up barriers and practice real-world self-defense shooting, you can still make your own training range of a sort at home.

Along with multiple targets, you can use anything handy for cover or a concealment barrier to practice shooting from different positions. A pet crate becomes a low barrier, and an A-frame step ladder becomes the side of a building and can be utilized for virtually any conventional or unconventional braced position. Desks, chairs, your child's play tent, all can be pressed into service as training aids and used as barriers. With this setup, your training is truly only limited by your imagination. Single target and target to target transitions are just the beginning. You can practice getting down to the ground, and transitioning from standing to kneeling to laying on the ground and back. Remember, should you be attacked violently, your opponent or opponents will do everything in their power to knock you to the ground by whatever means necessary. If they surprise you, there's a good chance they'll succeed. Then what? In that horrific circumstance you need to know how to draw and fire from a prone position. To do be able to do that effectively, you really ought to practice. The world in general, and your sights in specific, look very different from the deck. When was the last time you shot upwards?

### **Lasers and Airsoft**

While you don't want to be shooting live ammo into your basement wall or through your garage door, you can use a dedicated training gun like the SIRT laser pistol, a laser cartridge such as LaserLyte in your own personal defense weapon, or a realistic airsoft gun shooting plastic BBs.



Today's airsoft-type guns are available as realistic 1:1 replicas. Not only will they feel the same in your hand but the similar weight of the two will allow you to do thousands of draws and still be able to mimic that muscle memory when it counts. Another reason for spending that extra money on a quality 1:1 replica is that it is almost guaranteed to work with your existing carry holster. Just remember, these are training aids to supplement live fire, they are not a substitute for live fire.

If you are a competitive shooter, a replica gun also allows you to practice for matches in the comfort of your own home. Professional 3-gun shooters like Jesse Tischauser and Kalani Laker do it when they can't get out to the range. They are big fans of using airsoft guns to practice for competitions.

# **Dry Fire**

Although tactical training is important and may even prove essential to you overcoming a deadly threat one day, don't neglect plain dry fire. Dry fire with your unloaded carry pistol is the single best way to keep your skills honed and ready. That's because when you dry fire, you're practicing everything up to the point where the weapon goes "bang." In other words, all of the factors that determine where the bullet goes. Once you hear the bang, the outcome is already fixed. Dry fire is convenient, and you don't need to set up a tac range in your garage. You can do it in the comfort of your living room or bedroom. And it costs you nothing. In the process of dry fire you will be practicing drawing, grip, presentation, and the all-important trigger pull. Hundreds, thousands of times.

When it comes to shooting, whether for self-defense or competition, you get out of it what you put in. As someone once said, there are no shortcuts in life, and there sure aren't any when it comes to becoming a better shooter.

# **Lessons from Zimmerman: Part III**

I will not bother to go into the gross violations of protocol and police procedure that occurred when the Sanford city officials and Florida State Attorney Angela Corey became involved. I will merely state the results.

The Sanford Chief of Police Bill Lee was fired because he didn't file charges when his investigation determined that George Zimmerman acted in self-defense. He was fired for following the law, although the captain that replaced him and was tasked with the Zimmerman investigation came to the exact same conclusion.

Ben Kruidbos, director of Information Services for Angela Corey's prosecutor's office, was fired for providing discovery materials to the defense as required by law. State Prosecutor Angela Corey was withholding evidence, and she fired him.

The lead investigator, Detective Chris Serino, whose testimony backed up George Zimmerman and not Trayvon Martin, was busted back to police uniform rank.

Dismisses lawsuit seeking to ban traditional ammunition using lead That has to have a chilling effect on law enforcement in this country, to see people who were demoted or fired for following the law and not pressing for prosecution out of hand, and I think it has.

I routinely communicate with rank-and-file law enforcement at various state and local agencies across these United States, and despite their varied backgrounds and agencies, one of the things most are in agreement with is that their brass would not hesitate to throw them under the bus if need be. In fact, when the recent shooting of Michael Brown by Officer Darren Wilson in Ferguson, MO occurred, the consensus was that officer Wilson was wound around a decreasing diameter helical axis and would be sacrificed on the altar of political correctness, despite the fact that it certainly seemed to be a good shoot.

I know a sergeant in the Detroit Police Department, and his position (which I strongly disagree with) is to err on the side of caution and arrest everybody and let the prosecutor sort it out.

This may be the final lesson from Zimmerman, as played out in subsequent police encounters. If you are a cop, why risk your career by following the law as written, especially if it is about something that doesn't have the "right" type of public support? The worst case for a gun owner would be if he had to engage in a self-defense encounter, but I can see simple open carry fall into this in certain circumstances or with certain police officers or agencies and unflattering media attention. Indeed, we have seen this exact thing happen in Texas.

So the final lesson from Zimmerman is to be scrupulous in your actions, and be ready to back them up in a court of law if need be. The law is always your defense. Unfortunately, in today's climate you may need to pay for the privilege of exercising it, even when you shouldn't have to.

MOC: This month we're interviewing Michigan Open Carry member Glenn Disosway. Glenn, tell us a little bit about yourself!

did not shoot much for years. After Michigan became a "shall issue" state I decided I would like to get a CPL, but still for years I didn't do anything until I convinced my wife to go to a safety class with me. And so we went to a safety class and she enjoyed it, and I said I was going on for my CPL and she agreed to do that, so we both got our CPLs about six years ago.

MOC: When did you begin carrying a pistol for self-defense?

Glenn: After I got my CPL, I made a decision that I was going to carry, if not all the time, I was going to carry most of the time, both for self-defense and also because I thought that if good people don't carry guns then the only people with guns are going to be bad people, and so that played a role in my decision to carry everyday as well.

MOC: That's a very good point. You say that you usually bring a pistol with you on airplanes when you travel. Have you had any bad experiences with the TSA or have they all been pretty uneventful? Do you feel some airports are better or worse than others?

Glenn: Carrying a gun on a plane is easy. It's easy and almost painless. It slows me down maybe five minutes. You check in with the ticket agent, you sign the form stating that your gun is unloaded and that it's in a locked container. You follow the rules and it's easy. Airports are pretty consistent in how they do it. Probably the longest it's ever taken me was an extra ten minutes.

MOC: Do you have your hard case secured with a steel cable to the inside of your luggage to deter theft of your entire case by airport workers?

Glenn: Yes. I've got a small pistol-sized carry cases. I have one with a key and also one with a combination. They have cables and I always run the cable through the support bars on the suitcase, just to make it a little tougher for anybody to remove my gun.

MOC: Absolutely. There have been instances where gun cases have come up missing. As a matter of fact, about four years ago when Benjamin Netanyahu came to the United States he had two security agents with him and their guns came up missing. Their guns got stolen in one of our American airports.

Glenn: Yes, I remember that.

MOC: When did you begin open carrying? Why?

Glenn: After I had my CPL probably about two years I started occasionally open carrying. I just started doing it because I could, and strangely enough my wife prefers it when I open carry. I don't know why, but she encourages it. I haven't taken very much advantage of open carrying in the pistol free zones other than theaters. One thing I've found when I am open carrying is that it has always been a very good conversation starter, and it gives me the opportunity to talk to people about Second Amendment rights and also to encourage people to go get their CPLs and get some training. A lot of people see the gun, they're interested in it, they ask questions, and it gives me a chance to do a little bit of promo-



MOC: Can you tell us a little bit about your experiences open carrying?

Glenn: I haven't had any negative experiences open carrying. Most people will comment on my handgun. A couple of people may say something like, "Is it real?" and I answer affirmatively, but usually people want to talk about what kind it is. Some people will comment. I think there's been enough publicity from Michigan Open Carry that people ask, "Are you using the open carry law?" and generally I'll just say yes. I don't usually try to get into big discussions explaining that there's really not an open carry law, it's just a lack of a law against it that makes it legal. That's too confusing for some. The laws are so confusing it would tend to scare people away. I do encourage people to get training and also to get their CPLs.

MOC: What is your preferred carry gun?

Glenn: 1911. Most of the time I'm carrying a 1911 of one sort or another. Open carrying, I'm carrying my famous hard chrome Metro Arms American Classic with green pearl grips. Other carry I've generally been carrying a Commander size lightweight, either a Smith & Wesson or most recently a Colt. The Smith is an SW1911SC. It has ambidextrous safeties, which I like, and tritium night sights. This is what got me into carrying the lightweights. But since I got this Colt I've been carrying that instead. I will also carry a Bersa 380 Plus with a double stack 15-round magazine, sometimes as a backup gun and sometimes as a primary.

MOC: Tell us a little more about your personal life. What do you do for enjoyment?

Glenn: Most of the time we're at our lake cottage. I don't go fishing and don't boat much anymore. We also vacation at Disney a lot. We have annual passes to Disney World, we take several trips there every year, and we're probably on a couple of Disney cruises every year as well. I also participate in the Rockford Sportsman's Club Defensive Pistol shoots.

MOC: Is there anything you'd wish we'd have asked but didn't? This is your last chance to tell us anything about yourself that we didn't know enough to ask you about.


Glenn: No, I think you've about covered it. But I would like to say that I appreciate what the leadership of Michigan Open Carry is doing to promote not just open carry in Michigan, but gun rights in general in Michigan. They really have done a lot to improve our gun rights. I appreciate what Michigan Open Carry has done with regards to legislation, safety, and education, and that's why I joined and that's why I contribute to it. The gun laws in Michigan are terribly confusing, and it's very difficult to learn and understand them. # The Dangers of Intervention

There has been a lot of space devoted in the **Stopping Power Message Board** and other message boards to the presentation of hypothetical situations and a request for solutions. The problem with such imaginary situations is that there is none of the untidiness and ambiguity that exists in the real world.

Please understand that I'm not ridiculing those who present such situations or those who attempt to solve them. I consider those who post on this board as friends I haven't met yet. As your friend I feel a moral responsibility to share my observations based on my actual experiences in real incidents. I don't want to see good guys and gals get their selves in a jam by jumping into situations that are unclear and fraught with danger.

Let me be perfectly frank. Those who think that intervention will bring fame, honors, glory, etc., are delusional. I once prevented the rape of a woman by butt stroking her attacker with a shotgun while he was in the act of penetrating her. Weeks later she made an excessive force complaint against me. She thought I should have been more restrained in my behavior! On another occasion, my partner and I chased a holdup man into a store where he took a woman hostage. He then threatened to kill her (he had just shot two people in a bank and we believed him!) My partner shot the bad guys three times. One of those bullets slightly grazed the woman's finger and she sued us for endangering her!

If the rescued individual doesn't make life miserable for you in the courts, they just might kill you. I'm aware of four instances where officers responded to a domestic violence situation and when the wife realized the breadwinner was going to jail she assaulted and killed her would-be rescuers.

My Tac Unit partner and I backed up a precinct unit on a domestic assault arrest. As the husband was being handcuffed the wife disappeared down the hallway. I motioned to my partner and we followed her down the hall with guns drawn. We found her in the bedroom loading a Winchester .30-30 lever action rifle. We quickly disarmed and cuffed her. As we brought her into the living room a precinct sergeant ordered us to let her go. When we refused to do so, he attempted to remove her from our custody. When told him that if he didn't back off we would arrest him, he left to complain to our supervisors.

If ingratitude isn't enough we need to understand that things are almost never what they seem. What appears to be a carjacking may be the attempt by a father to recover a child from a noncustodial mother. Our intervention may not only be ill advised but we may be acting in violation of a court order. The fact that we are unaware of a court order will not save

the day.

Even if the situation is exactly as it appears and you're even in accordance with the law, you need to understand one simple fact—the law is what the local prosecutor says it is. Do you really want to spend seven years in jail waiting for an appeal to be heard and your conviction overturned?

I once got sued for in excess of \$100,000 for handcuffing a suspect. The city settled out of court even though my actions were totally legal. Anybody who read about this settlement in the paper would assume I was guilty of inappropriate behavior or some illegality. The city paid the settlement and provided legal counsel. Had I been acting as a private citizen I would have subjected my family to decades of poverty in order to pay the judgment and attorney fees.

Situations that involve significant injury or death are frighteningly expensive. My partners and I were sued for \$17.5 million dollars in the fatal shooting of a holdup man. The legal fees alone would have run into seven figures. We were accused of being blood thirsty, trigger-happy racist cops. The media conveniently forgot we had intervened in the severe beating and robbery of an elderly woman.

All that being said and experienced, I continued to intervene. However, people should be reminded I was a cop—it was my job. I spent 20 years going in harm's way for total strangers. Would I do that today? Probably not. I no longer have the deep pockets of the City of Detroit behind me. Sound callous? Well, would you be willing to jeopardize everything you own and your family's security for a total stranger? Would you be willing to lose your home, your cars, and your retirement to play Knight of the Round Table?

Apparently some people are certainly willing to fantasize about intervening in a hypothetical situation. Some may consider this harmless musing, but I find it troubling. Tactical planning involves assessing all the potential problems carefully and realistically looking at the cost of such intervention. Role-playing or gaming looks at it through rose colored glasses and ignores the cold hard reality of a person's involvement in a deadly force event.

I carry a gun to protect myself and the people I love from the monsters that roam the earth. When I'm away from those that mean everything to me, I carry so I can return to them. Are there circumstances where I would intervene to help a stranger? Yes, but such intervention would be on my terms at my pace. I am not going to jump into a situation with gun drawn.

Rather I would seek cover and carefully evaluate the **totality** of the circumstance. When I was convinced I knew what is really going on I would respond with the minimum amount of force necessary whether that required drawing my cell phone or my pistol. If all we have is a pistol we have severely limited options. I carry three pistols, OC [spray], cell phone, and a flashlight, and I am a PPCT Defensive Tactics Instructor. I am willing and trained to respond with the appropriate level of force even

if that is "only" a command voice. I understand the force continuum and know what the appropriate level force is in a given situation. Ignorance of such critical parameters can have horrific consequences.

Those who think the mere display of a weapon will stop hostilities are naïve in the extreme. The same people we will be confronting know what an appropriate level of force is and when we make outlandish or unjustified threats we'll show our true colors. These people can tell when we're serious and we will guickly find ourselves disarmed and in real trouble.

Again, we need to avoid rushing in where Angels fear to tread. Remember the most endangered species is good guys and gals. Go with God.

#### Oklahoma

SB 19 would allow licensed carriers to carry on a public bus

HJR 1009 requires strict scrutiny for restrictions of firearms freedoms

# Pennsylvania

Governor signs strengthened preemption into law

HB 2243 would make it illegal for most employers to forbid workers from keeping guns in their cars on company property

SB 1058 and HB 994 would create a cause of action against an employer for discharge or adverse employment action based solely on transportation or storage of a firearm or firearm ammunition in an employer parking lot

SB 1171 and HB 995 would allow a person with a handgun carry permit to carry a firearm in any state, county, or municipal park or other recreation area, would remove provisions allowing local governments to prohibit carrying in parks by resolution or ordinance


SB 1215 and HB 1255 would require the CLEO certify NFA transfers or firearms manufacture within 15 days

HB 481 and SB 70 would clarify that it is not an offense for a person to transport and properly store a firearm in a motor vehicle parked on school property

**SB 780** and **HB 535** would allow "constitutional carry"

HB 683 and SB 633 would prohibit schools from requiring students, parents, or employees to provide information on firearm ownership

SB 311 would repeal the prohibition on carrying in certain locations that are considered private property, private businesses

HB 216 reduces CHL age from 21 to 18

**SB 11** and **HB 937** would allow concealed carry on college campuses

**SB 17, HB 164**, and **HB 910** would allow CHL holders to open carry

SB 256 bans the possession or transfer of "large capacity magazines"

# Virginia

SB 1137, passed and awaiting the governor's signature, would prohibit local ordinances that ban concealed carry permit holders from transporting a loaded rifle or shotgun

SB 948, passed and awaiting the governor's signature, would prohibit sharing concealed carry license info with law enforcement in states that do not have reciprocity agreements with Virginia

SB 689 would allow concealed permit holders to obtain a lifetime permit

SB1132 would allow concealed carry on school property if no school event is in session

SB 828 would allow the possession of firearms on private and religious school property

HB 1329, passed by the House, would provide for recognition of out-of-state carry licenses

HB 2009, passed by both the House and Senate, would require CLEOs to sign off on NFA transfers

HB 2024 would prohibit the lawful carry of firearms in libraries

HB 1329 would allow all out-of-state concealed handgun licenses to be recognized

Told NRA was associated with Republican Party

"To summarize, we conclude that the Second Amendment protects an individual right to keep and bear arms. That right existed prior to the formation of the new government under the Constitution and was premised on the private use of arms for activities such as hunting and selfdefense, the latter being understood as resistance to either private lawlessness or the depredations of a tyrannical government (or a threat from abroad).
